Commission Updates

- Commission Renewal Visit #2: attended by 3 members of the Commission Staff
 - Self-Reflection
 - o Compliance Documents provided in both a Google Folder & Physical Binder
 - Staff did a file review of student records and safety requirements
 - o Classroom visits were limited this visit -
 - Interest groups and middle school mentorships were showcased as unique elements to our curriculum model
 - Community collaborations were highlighted and modeled
 - Student voice and choice in learning was exemplified
 - Engagement is high in learning through this model
- Renewal Process:
 - An application for renewal will be sent to schools in November
 - We do have a draft that we will be putting together for preliminary review/approval at our November 15th Governing board meeting
 - Populated application form including our STRIVE HI data and school information will be available mid-November
 - Application is due to the Commission on Dec. 15th
 - Commission staff will review and develop a recommendation presentation to the Commission for mid January.
 - Decision of award is to happen in that meeting
- Filling charter school advisory position: 2 are in statute to sit in commission meetings to advise and give perspectives from charter school leadership and Hawaiian-focused mission/visions. Jenn Hiro will sit in the position until July 2023.

Programs Review

- Title I \$62K: push-in support for student needs in reading, writing, math
- Title IIa \$5K Professional Development for HSTA members
- Title IV \$42K: enrichment and arts opportunities to increase student engagement in learning, provide a variety of modalities to learn content, increase student self-confidence in risk-taking and stamina for challenge

Curriculum

- <u>Balance</u> is our 2-year theme. All curriculum units and topics will circle back to the universal concept of balance: how it's formed, how it's created, what balance is vs imbalance
- Curriculum topics this year include: healthy foods and bodies, natural disasters, simple machines, community
- Teacher training and PD has focused on making our classrooms "thinking classrooms" where thinking is more visible, required and opportunities to "think" are intentional. Students are provided opportunities to improve their thinking skills not taught "what to think" but rather "how to think" through routines and prompts that after much practice become habits with the goal of becoming independent, critical thinkers who can contribute positively to our community with solutions, problem-solving skills, collaboration and positive interaction in issues and patterns in society.
